

### Looking for a college scholarship?

Become a member of our company. We cover all gear and approved training expenses, and if you serve for five years, you will be eligible to **attend community college at no tuition cost.** Without a sufficient number of firefighters, our mission to preserve the lives and property of Wilkins residents will be compromised. We also need associate members to help out with maintenance and administrative tasks. So please join us and let other residents know that we are looking for new members. To join our company, please call our station at 412-823-2322 and leave a message.

In the period January through July, we responded to 88 emergency calls. These include calls for fire alarms, motor vehicle accidents and fires, structure fires, and carbon monoxide build-up. As always, we trained and drilled to maintain and improve our skills in firefighting and rescue work.

On May 2, we were on-scene at the fire in the Brentmoor Arms Apartments in Penn Center until 4am. It was a bad, multi-alarm fire. Amazingly, only two people, a resident and a firefighter, had to be taken to the hospital but were released shortly thereafter.

Thank you to those who purchased strip tickets at our booth in the Summer Festival.

Our 2015 fund drive letters were sent out at the beginning of May. To those who have contributed to our annual drive, thank you. For those who have not yet done so, please donate. If you wish to contribute through the United Way, our code number 880323.

## Zoning Hearing Board Member

**T**he Board of Commissioners is seeking letters of interest from Township residents who wish to serve on the Zoning Hearing Board through December 31, 2017. Interested and eligible residents must submit a letter addressed to the Wilkins Township Board of Commissioners, 110 Peffer Road, Turtle Creek, PA 15145 no later than **September 30, 2015.**

**REQUIREMENTS:** Members of the Zoning Hearing Board must be residents of the Township and cannot hold any other elected or appointed office in the Township nor be an employee of the Township. Interested applicants must be able to read and interpret the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code and the Wilkins Township Zoning Code.

**FUNCTION:** The Zoning Hearing Board is a five member board appointed by the Board of Commissioners. The function of the Zoning Hearing Board is to hear appeals from the decision and/or interpretation of the Zoning Officer and hear requests for Variances and Special Exceptions as those terms are defined in the Municipalities Planning Code and the Township's Zoning Code. The Zoning Hearing Board meets on an as-needed basis on the fourth Thursday of each month. Zoning Hearing Board members receive an annual stipend of \$250.00.



# WILKINS TOWNSHIP BUDGET

## 2015 Budget Year-to-Date

As of August 14, 2015, the 2015 General Fund Budget is in great shape with no significant variances between actual and budgeted values. A majority of the Township's revenues are secured early in the year. As of mid-August, \$4.4 million of a budgeted \$5.2 million in revenue has already been received. This early revenue stream is what sustains the Township for a good portion of the remainder of the year. Expenditures outpaced revenues in January, February, June, July and through the mid-point of August. This tends to turn around in September and October because the Township will receive Commonwealth



subsidies for pension plans and fire insurance and will transfer funds received from gasoline taxes for highway maintenance expenses. As of mid-August, the \$2.8 million of the \$4.4 million received in 2015 has been expended. Of that amount 36.8% was spent on police department functions, almost 20% was spent on public works initiatives and 10.7% was used for refuse and recyclable disposal related expenses. The Board of Commissioners will hold the first meeting on the 2016 Budget on September 28, 2015 at 6pm. Subsequent budget meetings will occur at 6pm prior to the October 26th Board

meeting and again prior to the November 9th Board meeting. The first reading of the 2016 Budget is currently scheduled to occur at the November 9, 2015 meeting with final adoption slated for

December 14, 2015. If you are interested in the budget process, please come to the meeting. We would be happy to have you there!

# Rain Barrels and Stormwater Management

## What is a rain barrel?

A rain barrel or cistern is a rainwater collection system that stores rooftop runoff to be used later for activities such as lawn and garden watering, car washing, and even window cleaning.

## Why use a rain barrel?

Residential irrigation can account for 40% of domestic water consumption in a given area. This can be a problem particularly in summer, when the majority of outdoor water use occurs, and also the time when there is likely to be a water shortage. Collecting rainwater from your roof during storms by using a rain barrel can not only lower your water bills, but also help to decrease water demand during the hot summer months. Rainwater collection and reuse is beneficial to the environment because the stored water would otherwise run off into the storm sewers, bringing pollutants such as oil and grease, bacteria, and nutrients with it. Once water gets into a storm sewer, it eventually ends up in our streams and rivers. Also, the more rainwater that is reused, the less need there is for chlorinated or chemically treated tap water.

## Where can I get one?

You can purchase a rain barrel at most major lawn and garden centers. Call your local center to see if they carry them or can order a rain barrel for you. Or, if you are feeling especially creative, you can make your own rain barrel using a large trashcan, agricultural supply container, or other large container and a little ingenuity. Listed below are some links to rain barrel sources online. Barrel sizes range from 50 to 250 gallons, and prices range from \$99 to \$325 plus shipping charges.

## How do I install a rain barrel?

Most rain barrels are easy to install; however, actual installation methods




may vary depending on the individual brand of rain barrel. Installation of a typical barrel will involve disconnecting your downspout, cutting off a portion of the downspout and redirecting it into the top of the barrel. Most rain barrels have an overflow pipe that redirects the rainwater back into the downspout or onto your lawn or other surface in the event the barrel becomes full. Other

features may include safety features, spigots, connector barrels, mosquito proofing, and even water filters. Always be sure to empty your barrel before winter comes so you don't end up with a barrel full of ice!

## What are cisterns?

A cistern is similar to a rain barrel, but has much greater storage capacity, and requires a little more engineering. You can use a cistern to collect rainwater from your roof, filter the water, store it, and reuse it for your lawn and garden, or in your house for toilet flushing, clothes washing, etc. A cistern is considerably more expensive than a rain barrel, but can provide for more of your water needs, and may pay for itself in the long run.


