## WHAT'S GOING ON?

### Amphitheater Project

The Township Commissioners recently received notification that the Township will be awarded a CITF Grant in the amount of \$200,000.00 from the Allegheny County Community Infrastructure and Tourism Fund (CITF). These funds will be used to transform the former baseball field at the Municipal Building into an outdoor amphitheater with seating. This grant helps pave the way to Phase I of a larger project which includes building handicapped accessible pathways between the amphitheater and the Community Center, adding an outdoor seating area / deck in the back yard area of the Community Center and reconfiguring the parking arrangement at the Municipal Building. Look for further updates in future newsletters!

### Lions Park Renovation

The long-awaited renovation to Lions Park is set to begin! The Board of Commissioners recently awarded a \$485,901 contract to Sciarretti Site Development and Paving Company, Incorporated to make Phase I improvements to Lions Park as addressed in the Master Site Plan. These improvements will include the construction of a dek hockey court, new parking arrangements, preliminary construction for a future spray park and new playground, stormwater retention features and handicapped accessible

sidewalks. New fencing, benches and trash receptacles will also be installed. This project is funded through grants received from Pennsylvania's Greenways, Trails and Recreation Programs Grant (\$318,000), Wilkins Township Industrial Development Authority (\$91,000) and General Fund reserves (\$76,900).

### Linhart Park Playground Equipment

The Board of Commissioners budgeted funds in the 2018 Budget to begin the process of replacing worn/outdated playground equipment in the Township's three municipal parks. This year, Linhart Park will receive a new playground structure geared specifically to children between two and five years old. The structure will replace the existing merry-go-round. The Public Works Department will begin installation of the new equipment within the next few weeks. The Township has also applied for grant funding to add a second piece to Linhart Park and also to begin to change out some of the equipment at Eastmont Park.

### Wilkins Township Community Garden

Have you seen the GARDEN? We are growing collard greens, carrots, beets, onions, kale, broccoli, peppers, squash, spinach, lettuce, turnips, kohlrabi, chives, oregano, parsley and radishes! The garden looks great – the volunteers are

very dedicated!! The garden sits between Highland Avenue and Mortimer Avenue – you can get there by putting either 605 Mortimer Avenue or 612 Highland Avenue into your GPS. Want access to the garden? 
# DRUG TAKE BACK DAY

# CHURCHILL AREA ENVIRONMENTAL COUNCIL (CAEC) NEWS

## New Advisory

The CAEC has issued a new community advisory – “ADDRESSING COMMON CONTAMINANTS – ASBESTOS, LEAD, RADON” to inform residents about potential health dangers from exposure to three common contaminants that may be in our homes and the local environment. Known risks are reviewed along with recommendations on how to avoid and/or mitigate personal exposure.

This advisory is FREE and available at the Municipal Building during regular business hours. Or, you can download a copy anytime from the CAEC website hosted at <churchillborough.com> Simply click “Around Town” on the menu bar, scroll down to “Churchill Area Environmental Council,” and go to “Advisories.” Be sure to check for other recent advisories of interest to you, e.g. “The State of Recycling, 2017 Update,” “Marcellus Shale Update - 2016,” Sewage Overload Solutions - 2015” and many more.

The emphasis in all CAEC advisories is on local news pertaining to these topics.

## Environmental Graduation Award

The CAEC and its member municipalities (Chalfant, Churchill, Forest Hills, Wilkins) will sponsor a 2019 Graduation Award for a qualifying environmental project.

Any senior graduating from Woodland Hills High School in 2019 is eligible to apply, although the project may be completed during any high school year.

### The deadline for receiving applications is March 31, 2019.

The project cannot be an essay on some environmental topic or issue, but must represent “hands-on” activity initiated by the applicant in a leadership role. It must be carried out within the schools or municipalities of the WHSD.

For more information, examples of project topics and types, and a copy of the application form, go to the CAEC website (see above), the Guidance Office, or most department chairpersons at WHHS. A variety of new topics suggested this year should appeal to students in the arts, including environmental messaging (videos, public service announcements and/or commercials, poster displays, yearbook cartoons, and the like).

The Allegheny County Fire Volunteer Education, Service & Training Scholarship Program (FireVEST) provides full scholarships for an Associate's degree or certificate program at Community College of Allegheny County (CCAC), as well as training at the Allegheny County Fire Academy for our members who meet certain requirements and a commitment of five years of service. We will be happy to provide more information once you join our membership.

**Fall/Winter reminder:** please keep fire hydrants by your house free of debris and snow. Please don't plant bushes that might impede our access to a hydrant. We need them for our use and your protection.

We plan to be out on Halloween Trick or Treat night to help keep our kids safe. Please remember to drive carefully.

Always remember to keep the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors current by replacing them twice a year, every time we change our clocks.

## Yard Waste Drop-Off

During the month of October, there will be a Yard Waste Drop-Off Container behind the Public Works Garage at the Municipal Building. Residents can bring and dispose of yard waste materials as follows:

### Acceptable Items

Garden and Plant Debris  
Leaves  
Shrubs  
Tree Limbs Diameter of 4" or less

### Non-Acceptable Items

Grass Clippings  
Logs  
Whole Trees  
Building Materials of any Type

## Rules & Restrictions

No Plastic Bags  
Paper Recycling Bags are OK  
Remove Dirt from Root Balls

## Leaf Collection

The 2018 Leaf Collection Program is scheduled to begin on October 29. A complete schedule is included in this newsletter. So that we may stay on schedule we ask that residents place leaves out the day prior to your scheduled pick up day and place the leaves in rows along the curb line of the street and not large piles. Please remove branches, sticks, grass and animal waste from leaves because they clog the machines and cause down time for the workers.

## Linhart Park Compost Site

The Compost Facility is maintained by the Township and is located behind the ball field at Linhart Park. There is a large "pile" of composted leaves from last year which is very nice material and is available free of charge. Please note that this is limited to resident's use at their homes only and is not available to contractors and landscapers for commercial use or resale.

## Grass Clipping Composting

Again this year there is a posted area at the Township Leaf Compost Site at Linhart Park that *Residents* can drop off Grass Clippings and *mix* with equal parts of Leaf Compost (A Shovel is Provided). **We would also ask that Residents who do not bag their grass please do not blow the grass onto the street. This helps us keep our streets and catch basins clean and keeps unwanted pollutants out of our streams and rivers.**

## Snow Removal

Winter will be upon us soon and there some things that residents can do to help during snow storms: Yield to salt and plow trucks especially on hills. If you come upon a truck starting up or down a steep hill, wait and let it pass. Please refrain from parking in Cul-de-sacs. Do not park vehicles on sides of streets that are posted "No Parking," it makes maneuvering our trucks extremely difficult. Please maintain trees and bushes that overhang onto the street. This will help us to plow your street safely and doesn't do damage to the plow truck. If you have free standing basketball hoops that are either on or hanging over the street please move them back off the street.

Remember we are here to make your streets safe.






## Wilkins Township Century Club



The Recreation Advisory Board is already busy planning the 2019 Summer Series Events and hopes to see you there!






## Wilkins Community Garden First Annual Potluck Feast


